The Timmins Native Friendship Centre (TNFC) is an award winning Friendship Centre in Ontario and Canada. The TNFC provides services and programs to support the cultural heritage of Indigenous peoples and assist in their inclusion and participation in urban life. The Oppekehawaso Wekamik Child Care Centre encourages and creates a safe learning environment that promotes growth and holistic development for all children through play based activities. **“Oppekehawaso” is a Cree word that means “Raising the Children”.**

Our primary goal is to enhance the overall development of children to promote the retention of Aboriginal Culture and Language. The Oppekehawaso Wekamik has well defined play areas and structured routines. This is accomplished based on our vision and mission statement which include the Seven Grandfather teachings and the teachings of the Medicine Wheel.

Oppekehawaso Wekamik offers full day child care services to children 0 to 12 years of age. We also provide before and after school care for the children attending school full days. Programming is available to School Age Children (SAC) during the summer months. Frontline staff work a four day work week (36 hours per week).
